ARGYLE, TX (April 20, 2021) – During the Town Council meeting on Monday, April 19, 2021, Councilmembers continued to express their concerns about the Furst Ranch development. Council hopes that Jack Furst remains vigilant with his plans now that he is “going back to the drawing board.” Council also hopes he will engage with the community and local groups, something he failed to do previously, before developing his new plan.

Donated Police Vehicle

Town Council approved the donation of a vehicle from the Argyle Police Department to the City of Dawson Police Department. Dawson PD requested we donate a vehicle to them, as one of their vehicles recently became disabled due to a mechanical failure. They are down to one vehicle to patrol their city. Argyle PD has a 2016 Chevrolet Tahoe that is due to rotate out of our fleet and, instead of selling it at auction, we will be donating the vehicle to Dawson’s Police Department.

“We understand that we are extremely blessed in the Town of Argyle to have ample resources to carry out our mission, so when a request to serve another police agency by donating a vehicle came to us, I was excited to help,” Chief Emmitt Jackson said. “Knowing that the Dawson Police Department, who was down to one police vehicle, will now be able to more effectively serve their citizens, gives us great pride.”

Municipal Development District Appointment

During the Town Council meeting on Monday, Town Council interviewed and appointed Robin Massey to fill the vacant Place 3 seat on the MDD board. This position is a two-year term and will expire in October 2023. Robin is a local Realtor and owner of Turner Massey Realty.

Street Re-bid

The Town opened bids on the 2021 Street Improvement Program on March 25, 2021, consisting of the reconstruction of Harpole Road, South Gibbons Road and Charyl Lynn Drive. The Town received 8 bids ranging from \$1,024,010.91 from Reytech Services, LLC to \$1,253,736.50 from Pavecon Public Works, LP. The engineering estimate was \$1,141,233.50. Town Council rejected all bids and a new bid opening will happen on May 12, 2021. The recommendation for awarding the bid will take place at the May 17, 2021 Town Council meeting.

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
