ARGYLE, TX (May 4, 2021) – During the Town Council meeting held on Monday, May 3, 2021, Mayor Pro Tem Bryan Livingston recognized Peace Officers’ Memorial Day as May 15<sup>th</sup> in the Town of Argyle. MPT Livingston also proclaimed the week of May 9<sup>th</sup>-15<sup>th</sup> as National Police Week. Argyle Police Chief Emmitt Jackson has encouraged residents to turn their porch lights blue in observance and to keep them on throughout the month of May.

Chief Jackson also recognized former Police Chief Temple Cottle for his service with the Argyle Police Department. Cottle joined Argyle PD on December 8, 1998 and served as a Reserve Officer, Police Officer, Police Sergeant, Police Captain, then Police Chief from April 2018 until his retirement in October 2019.

### **Remembering Tom the Turkey**

On Monday evening, a shadow box containing recovered feathers from Tom the Turkey and a drawing of Tom done by a local artist were presented to Town Council. After the killing of Tom, his beard and several feathers were recovered by a taxidermist. The shadow box was donated to the town and will be on display at Town Hall.

### **Planning & Zoning Items**

The following four items were presented to Town Council on Monday evening after being recommended for approval at the Planning & Zoning Commission meeting on Wednesday, April 28, 2021: Castle Development Argyle Phase 2 Site Plan, Public Hearing: 816 5T Ranch solar SUP (NorTex solar), Public Hearing: 403 Trigger Trail solar SUP (NorTex solar), and Creekview Ranch Phase 2 Preliminary Plat.

The 816 5T Ranch solar SUP was tabled for the next Town Council meeting, on May 17, 2021. Councilmembers requested that the contractor be present to discuss approval. Also tabled for the next Town Council meeting was the Castle Development Argyle Phase 2 Site Plan. Councilmembers anticipate that revisions can be made, leading to an approval.

The Public Hearing for 403 Trigger Trail solar SUP (NorTex solar) was approved as well as the Creekview Ranch Phase 2 Preliminary Plat, a residential addition on approximately 48.05 acres with eight single-family lots, two non-buildable lots and a HOA common lot. Creekview Ranch Phase 2 is located on the west side of Fincher Road and south of Thornridge Circle.

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
